



WEBINAR: Preparing for RGGI Compliance

On behalf of the RGGI participating states, Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, Inc. (RGGI, Inc.) will host a free, two-hour introductory webinar on the RGGI compliance process for CO₂ budget sources. The webinar will provide an overview of the RGGI compliance process and an online Q&A session.

A regulated power plant (referred to as a “CO₂ budget source”) must hold CO₂ allowances equal to its emissions to demonstrate compliance at the end of each three-year control period. Under each state’s CO₂ Budget Trading Program, the first control period for fossil fuel-fired electric generators took effect on January 1, 2009 and extends through December 31, 2011. The deadline for CO₂ budget sources to provide CO₂ allowances for compliance and to certify compliance for the first control period is 11:59 PM ET on March 1, 2012.

CO₂ budget sources are encouraged to participate in the webinar, which will be open to all.

WHAT: Two-hour introductory webinar on the RGGI compliance process.

ABOUT THE REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE

The Northeast and Mid-Atlantic states participating in RGGI (Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island and Vermont) have implemented the first market-based, mandatory cap-and-trade program in the U.S. to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Power sector CO₂ emissions are capped at 188 million short tons per year through 2014. The cap will then be reduced by 2.5 percent in each of the four years 2015 through 2018, for a total reduction of 10 percent.
