Fact Sheet: CO₂ Budget Source 2018 Interim Control Period Compliance (Fourth Control Period)

Under each RGGI participating state's CO₂ Budget Trading Program, each "CO₂ budget source" is required to hold one CO₂ allowance for each ton of CO₂ emitted during the preceding three-year control period. The fourth three-year control period began on January 1, 2018 and extends through December 31, 2020 for the states of Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

Starting in the third control period, each CO₂ budget source must hold allowances equal to 50 percent of their emissions during each interim control period (the first two calendar years of each three-year control period). Each CO₂ budget source must hold allowances equal to 100 percent of their remaining emissions for the three-year control period at the end of the three-year control period.

The 2018 interim control period began on January 1, 2018 and each CO₂ budget source must hold allowances available in their compliance account for compliance deduction equal to 50 percent of their emissions by March 1, 2019.

The CO₂ budget source interim compliance process occurs in three stages: CO₂ emissions reporting, compliance activities in the RGGI CO₂ Allowance Tracking System (RGGI COATS), and public reporting.

1. CO₂ Emissions Reporting (CO₂ Budget Sources)

CO₂ budget sources are required to report quarterly CO₂ emissions data to RGGI participating states through the

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (U.S. EPA's) Clean Air Markets Division (CAMD) Business System

Dates to Remember for Fourth Control Period Compliance:

No later than October 9, 2018: CO₂ Allowance Auction 42 Notice Release

December 5, 2018: CO₂ Allowance Auction 42 (last quarterly auction to purchase allowances for 2018 interim compliance)

January 30, 2019: Deadline to submit Q4-2018 CO₂ emissions data to the U.S. EPA

March 1, 2019 (No later than 11:59 PM ET): Deadline to provide CO₂ allowances for 2018 interim control period compliance

March 4, 2019:

- CO₂ allowances are automatically deducted from compliance accounts (not including any CO₂ allowances which have already been surrendered)
- 2018 Interim Compliance Report publicly available

December 2019: CO₂ Allowance Auction 46 (last quarterly auction to purchase allowances for 2019 interim compliance)

January 30, 2020: Deadline to submit Q4-2019 CO₂ emissions data to the U.S. EPA

March 2, 2020 (No later than 11:59 PM ET): Deadline to provide CO₂ allowances for 2019 interim control period compliance

March 3, 2020:

- CO₂ allowances are automatically deducted from compliance accounts (not including any CO₂ allowances which have already been surrendered)
- 2019 Interim Compliance Report publicly available

December 2020: CO₂ Allowance Auction 50 (last quarterly auction to purchase allowances for fourth control period compliance)

January 30, 2021 (or the next business day): Deadline to submit Q4-2020 CO₂ emissions data to the U.S. EPA

March 1, 2021 (No later than 11:59 PM ET): Deadline to provide CO₂ allowances for fourth control period compliance and to certify compliance

March 2, 2021:

- First, second, third, and fourth control period CO₂ allowances in Compliance Accounts are frozen in RGGI COATS
- Compliance data submitted by sources publicly available

March 2, 2021 – April 1, 2021: States evaluate compliance for each CO₂ budget source

April 2, 2021 (Final Compliance True-Up):

- CO₂ allowances are automatically deducted from compliance accounts (not including any CO₂ allowances which have already been surrendered)

Following final compliance true-up, CO₂ allowances in Compliance Accounts are unfrozen in RGGI COATS (if no allowance shortfall exists after compliance deductions are complete)

(CBS) in accordance with state CO₂ Budget Trading Program regulations and U.S. EPA regulations at 40 CFR Part 75. Updates made in the CAMD Business System flow directly into RGGI COATS periodically. The final quarter of the 2018 interim control period is Q4-2018 (October 1, 2018 – December 31, 2018). The deadline to submit CO₂ emissions data to the U.S. EPA for Q4-2018 is January 30, 2019.

2. Interim Compliance Activities in RGGI COATS: Acquire & Provide CO₂ Allowances and Run Draft True-Up (CO₂ Budget Sources)

CO₂ budget sources are required to acquire and transfer sufficient CO₂ allowances in RGGI COATS into their compliance accounts to meet their CO₂ Interim Compliance Obligation (50 percent of the tons of CO₂ emitted during the preceding one-year interim control period, less any exempted emissions deductions) by the allowance transfer deadline of 11:59 PM ET on March 1, 2019. Market participants can obtain CO₂ allowances in quarterly CO₂ allowance auctions or through various secondary markets. Auction 42, to be held on December 5, 2018, is the last CO₂ allowance auction before the end of the 2018 interim control period. CO₂ budget sources must transfer and hold sufficient CO₂ allowances in their Compliance Account in RGGI COATS by 11:59 PM ET on March 1, 2019. A CO₂ budget source may also optionally identify specific CO₂ allowances to be used for interim compliance (or "surrender" CO₂ allowances) by using the Compliance Deduction Surrender Transaction in RGGI COATS between January 31, 2019 and March 1, 2019.

CO₂ budget sources must run draft "true-up" in RGGI COATS by 11:59 PM ET on March 1, 2019. This will compare their CO₂ Interim Compliance Obligation to the sum of the CO₂ allowances surrendered and those remaining in the Compliance Account.

Following the allowance transfer deadline, on March 4, 2019 CO₂ allowances will be automatically deducted from the CO₂ budget source's Compliance Account and transferred to the states' Surrender Accounts for interim compliance in accordance with the rules specified in each state's CO₂ Budget Trading Program.

3. Public Reporting (Public)

On March 4, 2019, the **2018 Interim Compliance Summary Report** will be publicly available in RGGI COATS.

In March 2020, the 2018 Interim Compliance Summary Report will be archived and replaced by the 2019 Interim Compliance Summary Report. At the end of the three-year control period, in March 2021, the 2019 Interim Compliance Summary Report will be archived and replaced by a fourth control period Source-Submitted Compliance Report. Following the states' evaluation of compliance, the fourth control period Source-Submitted Compliance Report will be archived and an updated Compliance Summary Report will be available.
